2. Confession and Assurance

- last Sunday we heard how the Lord told Joseph to take Jesus to Egypt because King Herod was trying to kill him. and we saw how this fulfils what God said through the prophet Hosea. let's have a look at part of this prophecy again now. it's on the screen or your notes at home.

'When Israel was a child, I loved him, and out of Egypt I called my son. But the more they were called, the more they went away from me. They sacrificed to the Baals and they burned incense to images.' Hosea $11 \times 1 - 2$

- here the Lord is saying that even though he rescued his beloved people out of slavery in Egypt, they turned away from him to idols, to made up, pretend gods.
- and, if we're honest with ourselves, we have done this too haven't we? maybe even this past week we have ignored God; not giving him a moment's thought in the midst of eating our Christmas meals and opening presents.
- so, let's confess this to the Lord now as we pray the prayer of confession

I'll give you a chance to read it through first, and maybe parents to make sure their children knows what the words say, before we say it together.

Most merciful Father, our Creator and Judge, we acknowledge and confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word and deed.

We have not loved you with all our heart; and we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves.

We earnestly repent, and are truly sorry for all our sins.

For your Son our Lord Jesus Christ's sake, forgive us, and strengthen us to serve and obey you in lives wholly renewed by your Spirit;

through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

- as we have just prayed; God wonderfully forgives us because of Jesus. and he does this because of his great love for us.
- look at how the Lord continues in Hosea 'My heart is changed within me; all my compassion is aroused. I will not carry out my fierce anger, nor will I devastate Ephraim again.' Hosea 11 v 8b/9a
- we don't deserve his love and forgiveness and yet the Lord God pours it out onto us. as the song we are about to listen to, or sing at home, says: how wonderful, how marvellous, is my Saviour's love for me.
- do stand if you wish and hum along, play egg shakers and I'll do some actions to the chorus if you are at home you can sing with gusto!
